Hedge Trimming



Go Tournaments at the Centre

Thirty-two players came to the Community Centre on 1st July to play the ancient oriental game of Go. The annual Cheshire Go Tournament has been played at the Centre since 2006. This year's edition was well supported by local players from clubs in Manchester, Liverpool, Lancaster and Chester, as well from London, Sheffield, Reading and Lincoln.

Liverpool student Chenghang Liu (5-dan) was the winner, beating Zhuopeng Yu (3-dan, UCL) in the decisive third round.

Other prizewinners were: Alvina Kwok (1-dan, London), Peter Newsome (12-kyu, Manchester), Elliot Barlow (15-kyu, Cheadle Hulme School) and Clinton Yu (19-kyu, Manchester).
